Doctoral Scholarship in Political Science

(three years, starting October 01, 2021)

The CGS offers **one three-year doctoral scholarship** to outstanding students holding a Master's degree (or equivalent) in Political Science. The scholarship is funded by the Reinhard-Selten Institute (RSI).

The scholarship holder will be integrated into the Cologne Center for Comparative Politics (CCCP) and the research program of the Cluster of Excellence "ECONtribute Markets and Public Policy" (jointly granted by the German federal and state government for the University of Cologne and the University Bonn). The doctoral student has the opportunity to participate in high-level research seminars, workshops and soft-skill courses, and will be part of a vibrant and international research network.

About the Program

The doctoral student will be enrolled in the Social Science doctoral track of the Cologne Graduate School in Management, Economics, and Social Sciences (CGS) of the Faculty of Management, Economics and Social Sciences (WiSo). The course program will start in October 2021. During the first year, students will take part in courses on multidisciplinary methods and theories, as well as subject-specific courses. Courses are taught in English. During the second and third year, students mainly conduct research and work on their thesis.

Qualifications

We are inviting applications by highly qualified graduates from Political Science. Candidates must hold a Master's degree (or equivalent) or be very close to completion.

Scholarships

The scholarship amounts to 1.365 € per month. The scholarship is awarded for a maximum period of three years.

Application is online only. In your application, please suggest a potential dissertation topic and supervisor(s) among the members of the Cologne Center for Comparative Politics (CCCP).
